CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY REMINDERS

The following are reminders for student-athletes about maintaining eligibility for the spring semester:

- You must be enrolled full-time to participate (NCAA Bylaw 14.1.8.1, page 130).
- You must pass 6 credit hours in the fall semester (NCAA Bylaw 14.4.3.1, page 149).
- If you are in your second year of school, you must maintain at least a 1.8 GPA (NCAA Bylaw 14.4.3.3, page 151).
- If you are in your third year of school, you must maintain at least a 1.9 GPA (NCAA Bylaw 14.4.3.3, page 151).
- If you are in your fourth or fifth year of school, you must maintain at least a 2.0 GPA (NCAA Bylaw 14.4.3.3, page 151).

ELIGIBILITY BETWEEN TERMS

To be eligible for competition that takes place between terms, the student-athlete shall:

- Have been registered for the required minimum full-time load at the conclusion of the term immediately preceding the date of competition, if the student is continuing enrollment; or
- Be accepted for enrollment as a regular full-time student for the regular term immediately following if the student is either continuing or beginning enrollment (NCAA Bylaw 14.1.8.2.1.2, page 132).

COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSIONS—Coaches

Head and Assistant Coaches: Number not restricted by NCAA

Volunteer Coaches: May only receive two (2) complimentary tickets to home contests in that coach's sport.

Football Graduate Assistant Coaches: May receive four (4) tickets.

Student Assistant Coaches: may receive four(4) admissions following the same guidelines as student athletes' admission process.

High School/Prep School/Junior College Coaches: may receive a maximum of two (2) complimentary admissions per event. Must be on a separate pass list designated for those individuals. Please contact the ticket office with specific procedures for this.

COMPLIMENTARY ADMISSIONS —Prospects & Student Athletes

Prospects: On an official or unofficial visit may receive three (3) complimentary admissions for use exclusively by themselves and those accompanying them on the visit. These may not be hard tickets and they must enter through a pass gate and sign for their tickets.

Student-Athletes: May receive four (4) complimentary admissions to a contest in their own sport. For post season events, this number may be increased to six (6). These tickets/admission must be through a pass list rather than a hard ticket and may be issued a pass or ticket stub to sit in a area reserved for individuals with all of those type tickets. Please contact the ticket office with specific procedures for this

COMPLIANCE SCENARIO!

The men's basketball coaches at NC State are recruiting Crossover Dribble, a prospect on the west coast. The coaches were only able to watch Crossover in person a few times, so they contact his high school and ask to purchase game film for the entire season. The high school normally charges \$150 for the videos. The cost includes blank DVDS, postage and a fee for the service provided.

Is it permissible for NC State to purchase the game film at this cost?

No. **NCAA Official Interpretation- 11/7/07- Purchase of Video from a Prospective Student-Athlete's Educational Institution (I)**- states that the committee confirmed that it is not permissible for an institution to purchase film or video (e.g., game film that includes prospective student-athletes) from a prospective student-athlete's educational institution at a cost that exceeds the value of a blank videotape or DVD (or other medium) and the cost of postage to receive the video. [References: Division I Bylaws 13.14.3.1 (published recruiting services), 13.14.3.2 (video services) and 13.15.1 (prohibited expenses)]
